> I am currently looking for the parents, and any additional
 >information that anyone might have about John Francis (M.?) Ross. I
 >have checked Census records, marriage records, as well as others and I have
 >found him in one or two places, but so far I have not come up with any
 >helpful information, as the only information I am really searching for is the
 >name of
 >his parents, and then possibly birthdates, and any other brothers or
 >sisters he might have had. I am really looking to find him in the 1850 Census,
 >or possibly 1860 census, as this should list his parents. I think I found him
 >in
 >the Forsyth County 1850 census, as the age matched up. He was living in the
 >William P. Henley residence. The birth date we have is 1846, and the 1850
 >census
 >lists him as 5 years of age, his approximate age. In the same residence is an
 >Amanda P. Ross. We think at this point that this could possible be his mother.
 >She is 30, meaning that she probably wouldn't be a sister, but possibly a
 >relative?
 >

In 1850 Amanda P. Ross is age 30, as you say, and is living with William P. and Sarah Henley ages 32 and 25 respectively, and Elizabeth Lindsay age 64, plus John Ross age 5.

Elizabeth BRIGGS married William LINDSAY 17 Feb 1807, Stokes Co. marriage bond

Elizabeth Lindsay is living alone in 1860, household 675, age 70

She is age 86 in 1870, living with A. Lindsay age 40, Forsyth Co. household 41 in Kernersville

Amanda Ross married Joseph ARMFIELD 15 Jan 1851, Forsyth Co. marriage bond

Joseph and Amanda appear in Guilford Co. in 1860, and back in Forsyth in 1870, but I don't see a child John Ross with them in either of those years. Joseph was born about 1800, and this would appear to be

a second marriage for him, since in 1860 Tabitha Armfield age 25 and William Armfield age 21 are also living with them.

Bottom line: Amanda appears to be the daughter of Elizabeth Briggs and William Lindsay, and Sarah Henley with whom she is living in 1850 is her sister. John Ross would appear to be her son. I don't have a record for her first marriage, but it's clear that she married Joseph Armfield in 1851, as Amanda Ross, and had additional children with him.

So where is John Ross in 1860??? I don't know, but would be very curious to find out.

OK, I talked at length with the church today. They had an addition to the Rosses-but probably not one that would help. Henry Clay Ross's wife was Jeana PINNIX, 22 Aug 1899 - 12 Dec 1985. Also, the Jane listed in the book was listed as a June in the church records.

The Rosses are probably connected, but are not buried near each other. They are all in the same section; Henry and Jeana are buried beside each other; (Section A, 196, 197) John W. is in Section A, 356. John F. is in Section A, 215, buried beside....Amanda P. Armfield (1820 - 04/1884). She is in lot 214, beside Joseph Armfield (6 May 1800 - 1 May 1892) (213).

Looks like your theory of John's father dying or divorcing may be correct. Unfortunately, that was the extent of the information readily available. They do have all the old church records in boxes which I can make an appointment to go through. The secretary there felt there was a strong possibility that the P. in Amanda's name stood for PINNIX or PORTER, as those are common names in that community, and the only "P's" in the cemetery. She also gave me the number of a church member ---Joe Pinnix, 84 years old, who might be able to help. I will give you his number-I'm afraid I rarely do blind phone calls to individuals (sorry!!!) 336-993-5642---should you want to follow up. There were no Rosses as current members of that church.

Let me know if this helps, so I'll know which direction to head!

THANKS A TON! That is indeed John Francis Ross. The dates are exactly what we had listed. Now it might make things a little bit confusing on my end trying to decipher who the Father is of the remaining 3 male individuals, but that definantly helps narrow things down! That is for sure him. I had not known that he was buried in Kernersville, I had always presumed he was buried in Rowan County. I know for sure they were in Rowan, as they show up in the Rowan 1880 Census. So that was also a useful piece of information to know about Kernersville.

So thanks a ton for all the research. I wondered, might there be a second page that listed Rosses? You included one page but it looked to me like it might carry over to a second page. I am trying to find an Amanda P. Ross as a mother, who is the only one listed with him in the 1850 Forsyth Co. Census, and they are both listed together in the Henley residence. She would have been born around 1825. This may not have been his mother, and I would be glad to disprove that, but that is my current theory.
